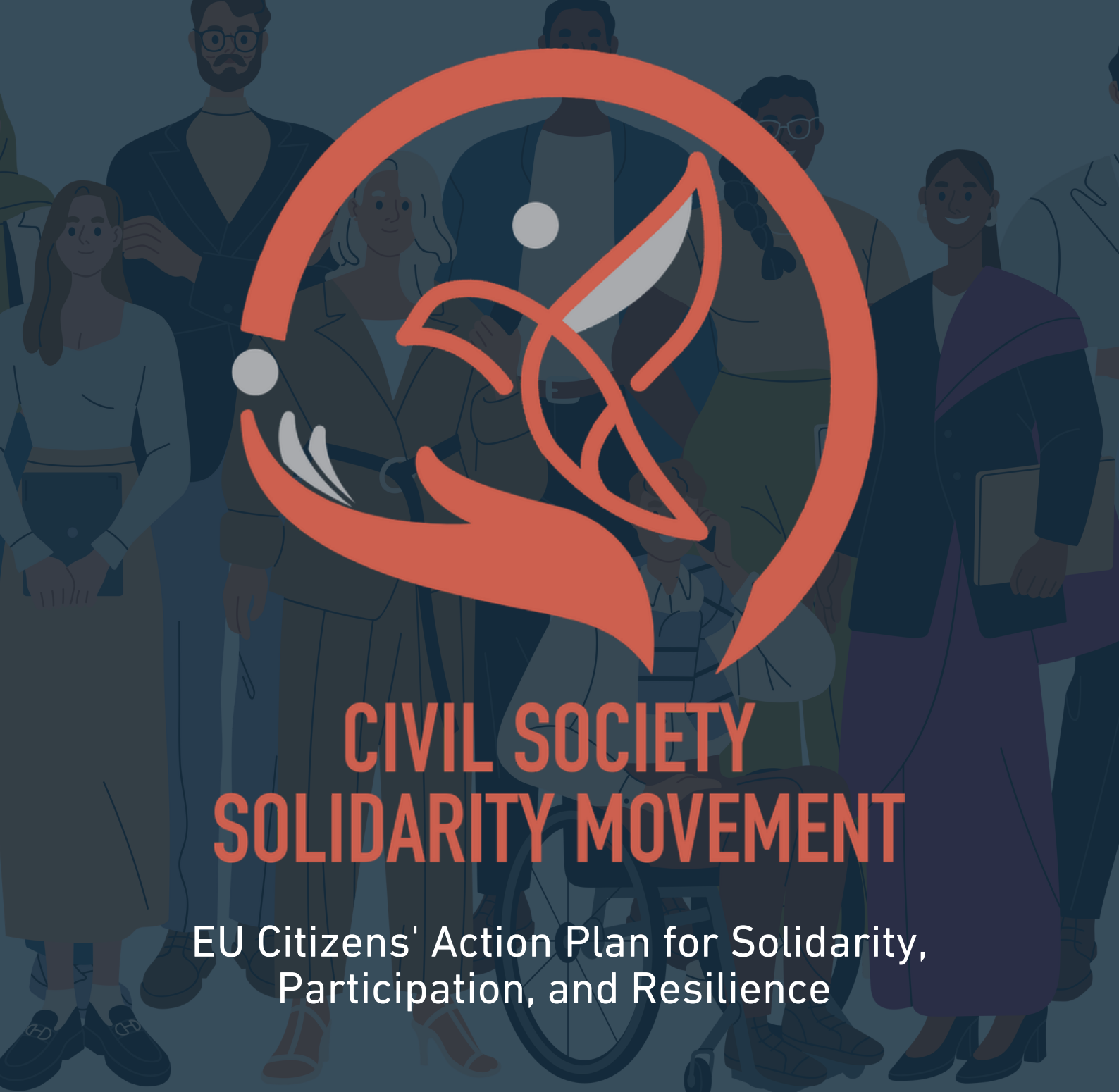

1. Civic Education Programs

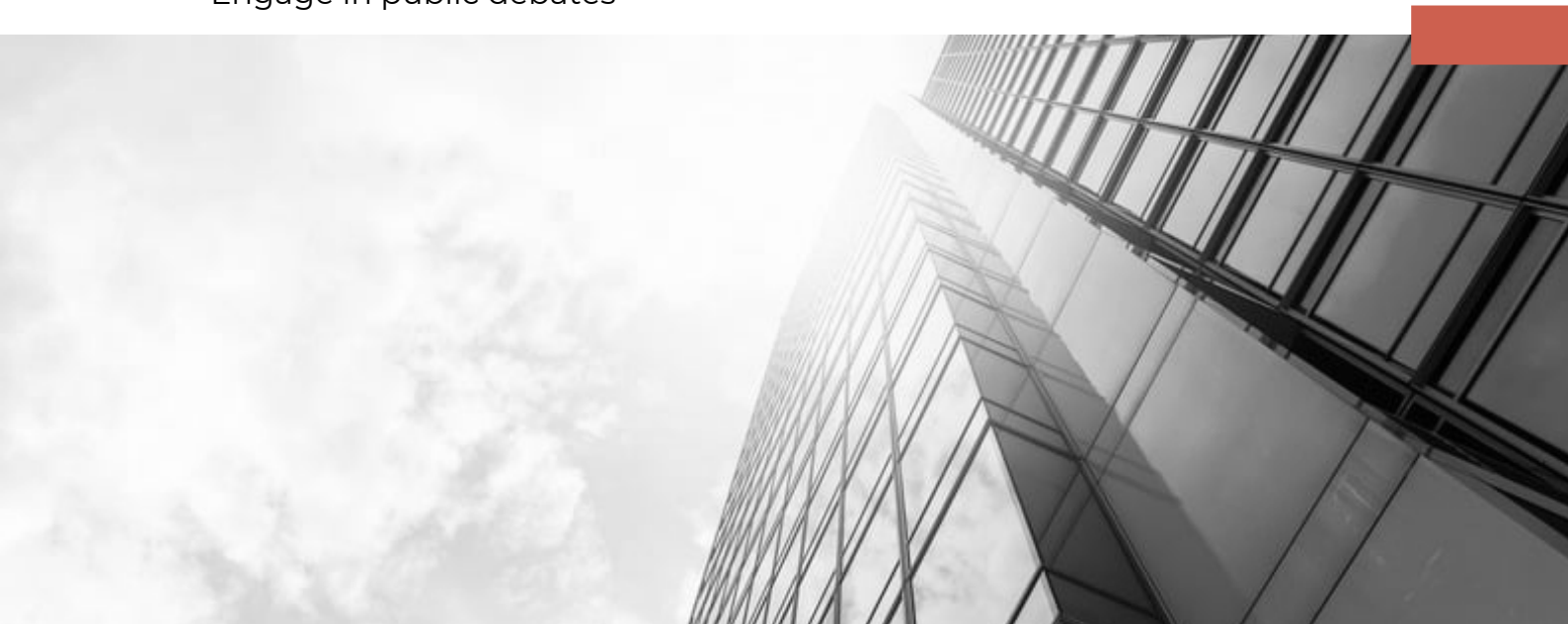
Educational initiatives can help citizens understand:

- Human rights





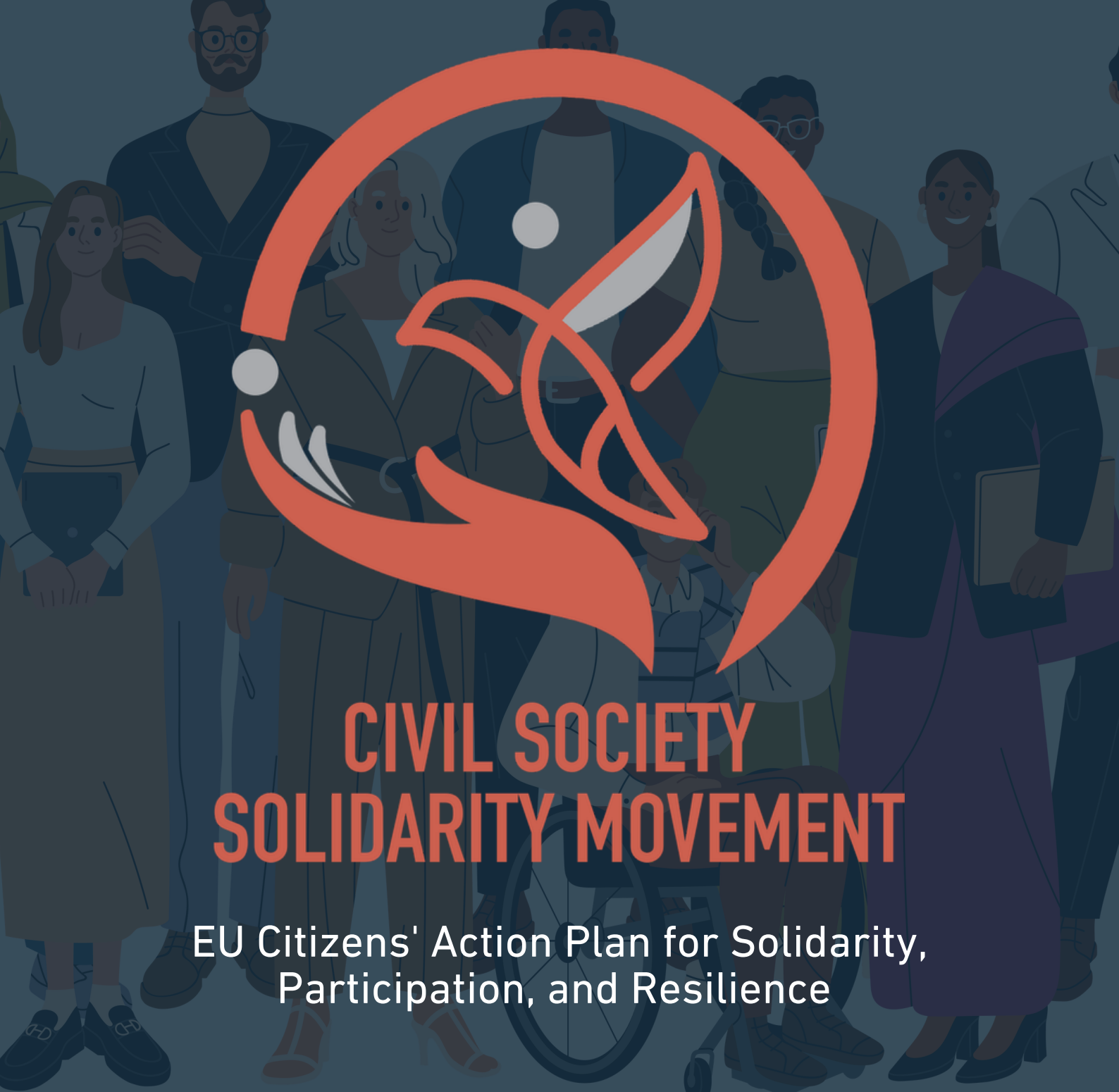
CONCLUSION
